

Florida's US Congress (2022) is divided into four county districts in Orange County, US Congress (2022) districts 8, 9, 10 and 11.

US Congress (2022) district 8 is located East of Orange County. The northern boundary follows along the Seminole/Orange County border, while the eastern boundary follows along the Brevard/Orange County border. the southern boundary follows along State Road 520 and extends to State Road 528 and the western boundary follows parallel to Dallas Boulevard and then extends to a section of State Road 520 and follows a stream of water passed the Lake Pickett Road and Fort Christmas Road intersection to the Seminole/Orange County border.

US Congress (2022) district 9 is located South of Orange County. The northern boundary follows along a road combination from Interstate 4, East Michigan Street and Curry Ford Road. The western boundary follows along Orange Blossom Trail and then extends to State Road 528 and Interstate 4. The southern boundary follows along Osceola/Orange County border and the eastern boundary follows along a section of the Brevard/Orange County border and then extends to State Road 520.

US Congress (2022) district 10 is located North of Orange County. The northern boundary follows along the Seminole/Orange County border, the western boundary follows along South Apopka Vineland Road and extends to a section of Interstate 4. The southern boundary follows along State Road 528 and then extends to a road combination of East Michigan Street and Curry Ford Road. The eastern boundary starts from State Road 528, then follows parallel along Dallas Boulevard and extends to a section of State Road 520, the boundary end just north of the Lake Pickett Road and Fort Christmas Road intersection.

US Congress (2022) district 11 is located West of Orange County. The northern and western boundary follows along the Lake/Orange County border while the southern boundary follows along Osceola/Orange County border. the eastern boundary follows along a road combination from Interstate 4 to Apopka Vineland Road and Clarcona Road, then extends to and follows along the Seminole/Orange County border.
