



Florida's US Congress (2022) is divided into four districts in Orange County, US Congress (2022) Districts 8, 9, 10 and 11.

US Congress (2022) District 8 northern boundary follows along the Seminole/Orange County border. The eastern boundary follows along the Brevard/Orange County border. The southern boundary follows along SR-520 and SR-528. The western boundary runs parallel to Dallas Boulevard then extends to a section of SR-520 and follows an unnamed body of water pass Lake Pickett Road and Fort Christmas Road intersection to the Seminole/Orange County border.

US Congress (2022) District 9 northern boundary follows along a road combination of I-4, East Michigan Street and Curry Ford Road. The western boundary follows along Orange Blossom Trail, then extends to SR-528 and I-4. The southern boundary follows along Osceola/Orange County border. The eastern boundary follows along a section of the Brevard/Orange County border and then extends to SR-520.

US Congress (2022) District 10 northern boundary follows along the Seminole/Orange County border. The western boundary follows along South Apopka Vineland Road and extends to a section of I-4. The southern boundary follows along SR-528 and then extends to a road combination of East Michigan Street and Curry Ford Road. The eastern boundary starts from SR-528, then follows parallel along Dallas Boulevard and extends to a section of SR-520. The eastern boundary end just north of the Lake Pickett Road and Fort Christmas Road intersection.

US Congress (2022) District 11 northern and western boundaries follow along the Lake/Orange County border. The southern boundary follows along Osceola/Orange County border. The eastern boundary follows along a road combination I-4, Apopka Vineland Road, Clarcona Road and the Seminole/Orange County border.
