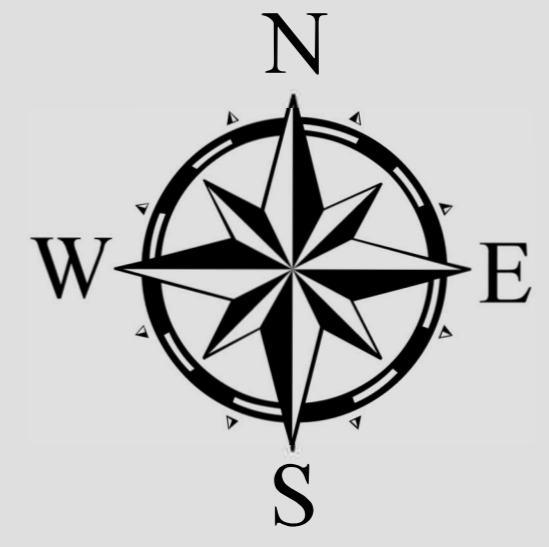

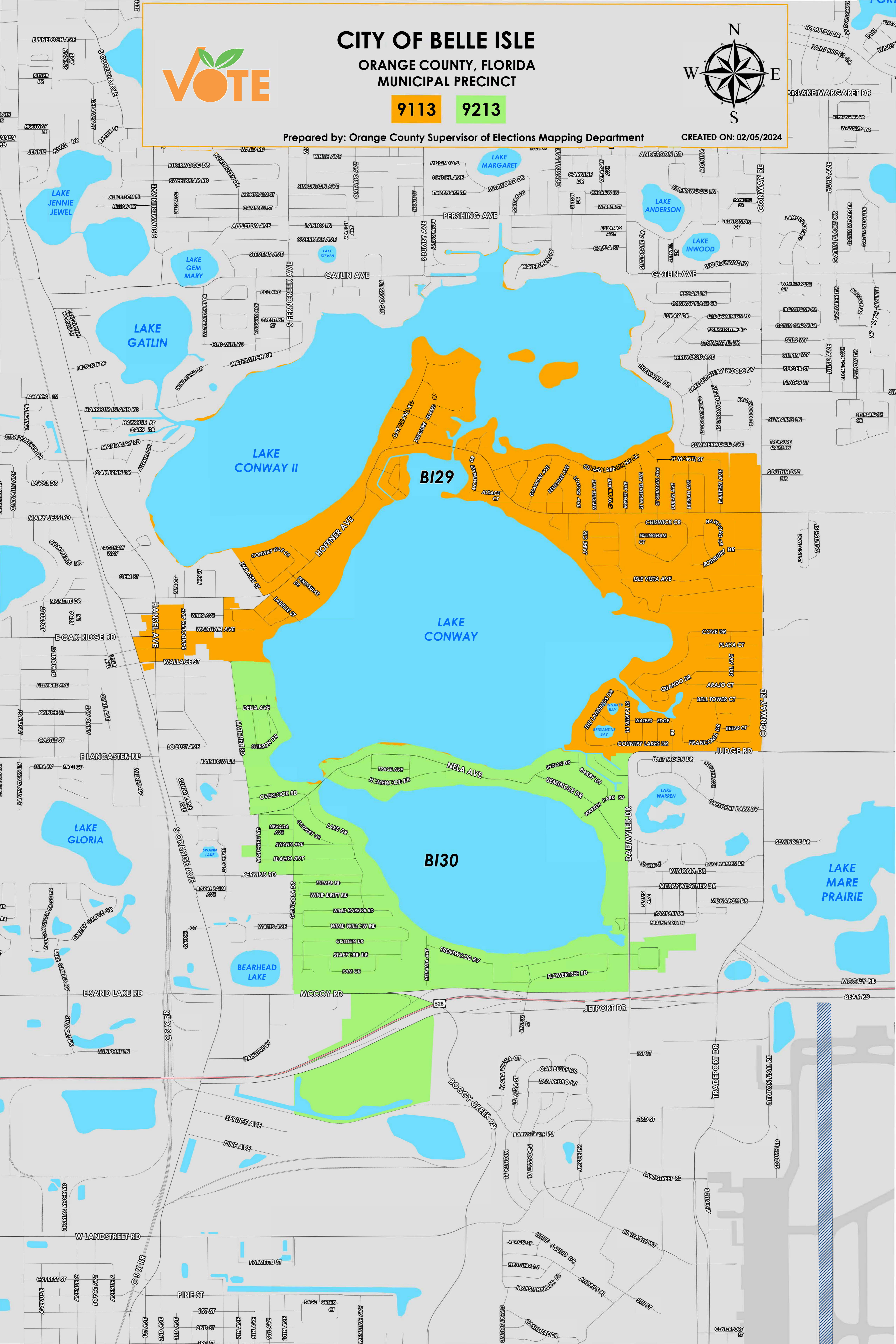

The City of Belle Isle in Orange County, Florida has two municipal precincts, BI29 (9113) and BI30 (9213).

Municipal precinct BI29 approximately ends in the south at Judge Road and the northern edge of Lake Conway, ends in the west at Orange Avenue, and ends in the east at Tradeport Drive. The northern edge follows just north of Hoffner Avenue, Oak Island Point, and Cullen Lake Shore Drive. Within these borders are many sections which are considered unincorporated Orange County, and not part of the City of Belle Isle. This municipal precinct also includes the following Orange County precincts:

- 333

Each listed Orange County precinct is partially made up of the City of Belle Isle and partially unincorporated Orange County, which change according to municipal annexation ordinances.

Municipal precinct BI30 is located to the south of municipal precinct BI29. This precinct approximately extends north to the southern edge of Lake Conway, ends in the south at McCoy Road and the railroad between Boggy Creek Road and Orange Avenue, and ends in the west at Gondola Drive and Matchett Road. The eastern boundary extends just east of Brighton Park Circle and along Daetwyler Drive. Within these borders are many sections which are considered unincorporated Orange County, and not part of the City of Belle Isle. This municipal precinct also includes the following Orange County precincts:

Each listed Orange County precinct is partially made up of the City of Belle Isle, and partially unincorporated Orange County.
