







The City of Orlando in Orange County, Florida contains municipal districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

The City of Orlando approximately extends north to Edgewater Drive and Corrine Dr, ends in the south at the Orange/Osceola County border, O.U.C Railroad, and Sand Lake Rd, ends in the west, east of Turkey Lake Rd, Florida Turnpike, and Pine Hills Road, and ends in the east at Narcoossee Road, south of Innovation Way, Young Pine Road, west of Goldenrod Rd and west of Semoran Blvd. Within these borders are many sections which are considered unincorporated Orange County, and not part of the City of Orlando. This municipal precinct also includes the following Orange County precincts:

Each listed Orange County precinct is partially made up of the City of Orlando and partially unincorporated Orange County, which changes according to municipal annexation ordinances.

\*Note that these Orange County Precincts include portions of multiple municipal precincts and unincorporated Orange County.
