



Florida State Senate (2022) is divided into five separate districts. State Senate (2022) Districts 10, 13, 15, 17, and 25.

State Senate (2022) District 10 northern boundary follows along the Seminole/Orange County border. The western boundary follows along John Young Parkway and I-4. The southern boundary follows along a road combination of Virginia Drive, Corrine Drive, Glenridge Way, and Baldwin Park Street. The eastern boundary follows along North Semoran Boulevard.

State Senate (2022) District 13 northern boundary follows along the northern shore of Johns Lake and extends to I-91. The western boundary follows along the Lake/Orange County border. The southern boundary follows along the Osceola/Orange county border. The eastern boundary follows along I-4, Doctor Phillips Boulevard and South Hiawassee Road.

State Senate (2022) District 15 northern and western boundaries follow along Lake/Orange County border. The southern boundary follows along I-91 and extends to Sand Lake Road. The eastern boundary follows along a railway, extends to I-4 and John Young Parkway.

State Senate (2022) District 17 northern boundary follows along the Seminole/Orange County border. The eastern boundary follows along the Brevard/Orange County border. The southern border follows along the Osceola/Orange County border. The western boundary follows a road combination from Boggy Creek Road, Tradeport Drive, extends along a railway, I-4 and North Semoran Boulevard.

State Senate (2022) District 25 northern boundary follows along Sand Lake Road. The western boundary follows along I-4. The southern boundary follows along the Osceola/Orange County border. The eastern boundary follows along Boggy Creek road and Tradeport Drive.
